Blessing of the Children - Br. Samuel

V'ahavta et YHWH Elohecha, b'chol l'vavcha uv'chol nafsh'cha uv'chol m'odecha.

V'hayu had'varim ha-eileh asher anochi m'tzav'cha hayom al l'vavecha.

V'shinantam l'vanecha v'dibarta bam b'shivt'cha b'veitecha uv'lecht'cha vaderech uv'shochb'cha uv'kumecha. Uk'shartam l'ot al yadecha v'hayu l'totafot bein einecha. Uch'tavtam al m'zuzot beitecha uvish'arecha.

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Food For Thought

- How many of the 10 commandments can we find within today's Torah portion?
- Let's look a little further and see how many we can come up with

The 10 Commandments established before written

- Shabbat (4th)
- Dietary Instructions (1st / 2nd)
 - Lust / Covetousness (10th)
 - The Original Covering for Sin
- Marriage (7th)
- Murder (6th)
- Other Commands established before being written
 - Adding to the Word
 - First Fruit Offerings

Shabbat - 4th of the 10

- Blessed by Yahweh Elohim
- A day of rest from our works as He rested from His works
- Set apart from all the other days
 - The only day with a Name (Shabbat)
- The most disputed and argued command
 - Some Christians say it was changed to the Lord's Day
 - Other's say it don't matter, we can worship any day of the week

Dietary Instruction - 1st & 2nd of the 10

- Given to the Man before the woman was created
 - "From all the trees of the garden you are most welcome to eat. But of the Tree of Knowledge of Good and Evil *you must not eat*. For when you eat from it, *you most assuredly will die*."
 Genesis 2:16-17

Dietary (continued)

- The serpent was used to inject false instruction to the woman
 - Did she hold what the serpent said over Yahweh's instruction?
 - Yes, breaking commandment #1
 - Did she lust for the image of the fruit?
 - Yes breaking commandment #2 (arguably)
 - Did she add to the Command of Yahweh?
 - Yes, she added if we touch it we shall die (Gen 3:3)

Lust/ Covetousness (10th Commandment)

- The woman saw the tree was good for food, and that it was a thing of lust for the eyes. (Gen 2:6)
 - Lust, covetousness (synonyms)
- By eating of which was forbidden, both man and woman were aware of their nakedness – thus making coverings for themselves of leaves.
 - They tried to use leaves to hide their sin
 - Covering their nakedness they were now aware of
 - Hid from Yahweh in the garden

Covering for Sin

- Tunics of skin were made the first sacrifice for sin conducted by Elohim
 - He made tunics to cover our sin
 - Does Y'shua cover our sins as well?
- Interesting side note Elohim said "Behold the man has become like one of <u>Us</u>, knowing good and evil."
 - Many dispute Y'shua's deity (who was there with Yahweh during the creation if it was not Y'shua?)

Marriage (7th Commandment)

- This is why a man leaves his Father and his mother and clings to his wife, and they become one flesh
 - This will be important in future teachings, so keep this in mind
- The 7th commandment is do not commit adultery
 - Does this apply to marriage
 - Is this only applicable between husband and wife?
 - Or can we commit this against Yahweh?

Murder (6th Commandment)

- It was in the 2nd generation of mankind that the first murder was committed
 - Only 1 generation after Adam
- It was a brother killing a brother
 - What was the cause of the murder?
 - Jealousy?
- Nugget The murderer was not killed immediately – any thoughts as to why not?
 - Could it be there was not 2 or 3 witnesses?
 - The ground was a witness it cried out to Yahweh

Adding to the Word of Elohim

- Was it the woman or the serpent who added to the word of Elohim?
 - The woman she added we must not touch it or we will die
 - This is the first account of adding to the word of Yahweh

First Fruit Offerings

- Cain
 - Brought offering of fruit of the ground
 - · Yahweh did look favorably on this offering
 - Jealousy / Covetousness / Anger consumed Cain
- Able
 - Brought offering of first born of the flock
 - Yahweh did look favorably
- Tidbit Does your Bible tell you how Cain killed able?
 - No? where does the story of the rock come from then

Genealogy - Look at these life spans

- Adam 930 years
- Sheth 912 years
- Enosh 905 years
- Qeynan 910 years
- Mahalal'el 895 years
- Yered 962 years
- Hanok 365 years
- Methyshelah 969 years
- Lemek 777 years

Genealogy - Continued

- Noah
 - Considered righteous, as he walked with Elohim
 - 3 sons Shem, Ham and Yapheth
 - I don't recall seeing his wife's name here?
- Next Shabbat we will be covering more about Noah
