Exodus [Shemot] 35:1-38:20

Training our youth to be sons and daughters of the commandments.

"If you love me, keep my commandments." Yeshua (John 14:15)

PORTION IN A NUTSHELL

VAYAKHEL (HE GATHERED)



Moshe gathered the people and told to work six days and have rest on the seventh day. He told them that they were not allowed to kindle a fire in their dwelling places on the

Sabbath day. Moshe told the people to make a contribution to Yahweh. Whoever was of a generous heart was to bring gold, silver, bronze, blue and purple and scarlet yarns, find twined linen, goat's hair, ram's skins, goat skins, acacia wood, oil, spices, onyx and stones. Craftsman were told to come and make things for the tabernacle of Yahweh. All the people whose heart was stirred came and brought Yahweh's contribution. This was a freewill offering to Yahweh. Bezalel (the son of Uri, the son of Hur, of the tribe of Yahudah) was called by name and filled with the Ruach HaChodesh (Holy Spirit) and with skill. Oholiab (the son of Ahi-samach of the tribe of Dan) was filled with skill by Yahweh. These two worked on the sanctuary in accordance with all that Yahweh commanded. Bezalel made the ark of acacia wood. He also made the table of acacia wood, lamp stand, the altar of incense, the altar of burnt offering, the bronze basin, and the court.



Exodus 36:5-6 And they spake unto Moses, saying, The people bring much more than enough for the service of the work, which Yahweh commanded to make. And Moses gave commandment, and they caused it to be proclaimed throughout the camp, saying, Let neither man nor woman make any more work for the offering of the sanctuary. So the people were restrained from bringing.



YAHWEH WANTS YOU: 101

Could you ever imagine giving so much that you're told to stop? That's what happened with the children of Israel when they brought "much more than enough for the service of the work, which Yahweh commanded to make (Ex 36:5)." These worshippers were willing to give more than enough for the sake of service of their Elohim. This portion of scripture reminds me of the good Samaritan and the poor widow. In both of these stories we see evidence of the two commandments that sum up the entire law. The widow only had two coins, yet she gave it all to Yahweh. She gave Yahweh ALL that she had! Then there is the Samaritan, who went above and beyond the call of duty to help someone. The man from Samaria not only wrapped up the victim's wounds, but also took him to an inn to take care of him some more and then if that wasn't enough, the Samaritan left gave money to people to take care of him... WAIT! He's not done yet!!! After all of that, he told those who were left to take care of him that if more was needed for his care, he would give it to them when he returned! Thou shalt love Yahweh thy Elohim with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy strength, and with all thy mind; and thy neighbor as thyself. ~Luke 10:27


