PORTION IN A NUTSHELL

PEKUDEI (COUNTINGS)

Bezalel and Oholiab made the materials for the tabernacle and wove the priestly garments. Yahweh told Moshe to erect the tabernacle of the tent of meeting on the first day of the first month and anoint it with oil. Moshe obeyed. Then the cloud covered the tent of meeting and the glory of Yahweh filled the tabernacle. Moshe was not able to enter the tent of meeting because the cloud settled on it and the glory of Yahweh filled the tabernacle. The cloud of Yahweh was on the tabernacle by day and fire was in it by night in the sight of all the house of Israel throughout all their journeys.



Stop and Study



Acts 18:1-3 After this, Paul left Athens and went to Corinth. There he met a Jew named Aquila, a native of Pontus, who had recently come from Italy with his wife Priscilla, because Claudius had ordered all Jews to leave Rome. Paul went to see them, and because he was a tentmaker as they were, he stayed and worked with them.

Mark 5:30-31 "At once Yahshua realized that power had gone out from Him. He turned around in the crowd and asked, 'Who touched My clothes?' 'You see the people crowding against You,' His disciples answered, 'and yet You can ask, Who touched Me?'"

Numbers 15:37-41 "Yahweh said to Moses, 'Speak to the Israelites and say to them: Throughout the generations to come, you are to make tassels on the corners of one's garments, with a blue cord on each tassel. You will have these tassels to look at and so will remember all the commands of Yahweh, that you may obey them and not prostitute yourselves by going after the lusts of your own hearts and eyes. Then you will remember to obey all My commands, and will be consecrated to your Elohim. I am Yahweh your Elohim.'"

Malachi 4:2 "But for you who revere My Name, the sun of righteousness will rise with healing in His wings"

"But for you who revere My Name, the sun of righteousness will rise with healing in His wings" (Mal. 4:2). The Hebrew word for "wings" used in this passage is *kanaf*, which is a word that specifically means the fringe-like feathers or **edges** of a bird's wing. Have you ever seen a tallit? It is a rectangle with four corners. On each of the four corners is a fringe or tassel. A tallit looks like wings when arms are raised under it in prayer. In Matthew 9:20-22, we read a story of a sick woman receiving healing simply by touching Yahshua's clothes: **"Just then a woman, who had been subject to bleeding for twelve years, came up behind Him and touched the hem of His garment; for she said to herself, 'If I only touch His cloak, I will be healed.' Yahshua turned and saw her. 'Take heart, daughter,' He said, 'your faith has healed you.' And the woman was healed from that moment."** Remember, Yahweh wants the best for you: in health, in life, and in every way. He gave you an immune system, rules for how to live a healthy life, and a gracious healing savior who miraculously heals His people of their infirmities when they call on Him. **So, pray! Believe! And Receive the fullness that Yahweh has for you... come under the wings of our Father and find mercy and grace to help in your time of need.** (Heb. 4:16).



The Tent Maker



Just like Bezalel and Oholiab were weavers, the apostle Paul (Shaul) also made woven garments. In Acts, we learn that Paul was a tent maker. It is widely believed that he didn't make tents for camping or for traveling through the desert. He was a tallit maker. A tallit is a prayer shawl. It covers the shoulders of the one who wears it. On the corners of the tallit are tassels called Tsit Tsit. Yahweh commands that we wear tsit tsit on the four corners of our garment in the Torah.

Numbers 15:37-41 "Make tassels on the corners of your garments to remember all the commandments of Yahweh, to be holy before Yahweh because I am Yahweh your Elohim who brought you out of Egypt to be your Mighty One."

Deuteronomy 22:12 "You shall make tassels on the four corners of your garment with which you cover yourself."

Acts 18:1-4 After this, Paul left Athens and went to Corinth. 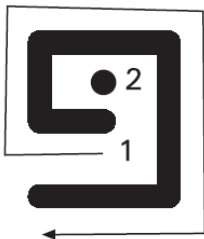
