Why Do We Obey?

Do you want to live a long life? Do you want to be healthy and have things go well for you? These are the promises of obeying Yahweh's commandments (Proverbs 3:1-2, 10; 4:4, 20-22, Deuteronomy 28; 30:19). There are even eternal promises for obeying Yahweh's commandments. Yahshua tell us that if we keep Yahweh's law and teach others to keep Yahweh's law that we will be great in the

kingdom of heaven. When we choose to obey Yahweh's law, we choose LIFE, but when we choose disobedience, we choose the opposite of life and the consequences are not fun (Deuteronomy 30:19). So why should be obey our Father's commandments? Is it because of all of the blessings that come with obedience? No... that's not why we should obey. We should obey, just because He told us to.



PORTION IN A NUTSHELL - SHEMOT











There was a new pharaoh in Mitsrayim who didn't know about Yosef. Moshe was born even though pharaph wanted to kill all of the male babies. Moshe's mother put him into a papyrus basket and set him in the river to keep him safe. Moshe was nursed by his real mother and then adopted by pharaoh's daughter when he was done nursing. When Moshe grew up, he killed a slave master from Mitsrayim and ran away to Midian. In Midian, Moshe married Tzipporah. Meanwhile, back in Mitsrayim the pharaoh died and another rose to power. Yahweh heard Israel's cries and prayers and took compassion on them. Yahweh appeared to Moshe in a burning bush and told him to go to Mitsrayim to free Israel from slavery. Yahweh gave Moshe signs to show the people so that they would believe that he was sent by Yahweh. Moshe asked Yahweh to send someone else. Yahweh became angry. Aharon was chosen to go with Moshe to the people. Yahweh called Israel his firstborn son. Moshe shows Aaron, the elders of Israel, and the Israelite people the signs that Yahweh told him to use and they believed and worshipped Yahweh. Pharaoh refused to let the people go to the desert to offer sacrifices to Yahweh. Pharaoh became angry and forced the Israelite slaves to make bricks without straw. Yahweh promises to use a mighty hand to deliver Israel from bondage in Mitsrayim.

RIGHTEOUS (verb)

Always behaving according to a moral code, strictly observant of morality. Considered to be outstanding.

STATUTE (noun)

A permanent, established law.

Commandment (noun)

A command from Yahweh.

What is the LAW?

The law is our standard to live by. It is instruction for our daily lives. We learn how to live a prosperous life when we know Torah.

How can I learn all of it?

Each week in congregations, a portion of the Torah is read. We begin to hear a little each week until we have heard it all. Some parts give instruction to men, some to women, some to kids, and some to priests. Don't forget to ask questions if you don't understand something.

What does it SAY?

A summary of the law is found in Exodus 20:3-17. This passage is the Ten Commandments. The first five commandments show us how to love Yahweh our Elohim. The last five commandments show us how to love our neighbor (Romans 13:9). Further simplified, the entire law is summed up in two commandments (Matthew 22:36-40, Deuteronomy 6:4-5, Leviticus 18:19). Thou shalt love Yahweh our Elohim and love your neighbor as yourself.

**ALEF: Alef is a silent letter; it has the numerical value of 1; it stands for ox, strength, leader, first.




☐ BET: Bet sounds like "b"; it has the numerical value of 2; it means house, in, into.

SHEMOT in Hebrew means "**NAMES**." It is plural. Its singular form **SHEM** means "**NAME**" and is written in Hebrew below.


