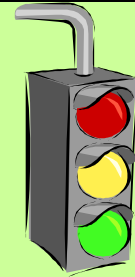

PORTION IN A NUTSHELL

BEHA'A LOT'CHA (SEND)

Yahweh instructed Moshe to speak to Aharon and tell him rules regarding the seven lamps. He also told Moshe about the cleansing of the Levites (priests) and what offerings had to be made. They did all that Yahweh commanded. The Levites were to perform priestly duties in the tent of meeting when they turned 25 and they could stop ministering when they turned 50 but had to help by keeping guard. Yahweh instructed the people regarding Pesach (Passover). It was to be kept on the 14th day of the first month at twilight. The people kept Passover in the Wilderness of Sinai. Certain men came to Moshe and Aharon because they were un-clean because of a dead body. Yahweh told them that if anyone is un-clean on the day of the Passover, that they were to keep the Passover on the 14th day of the second month instead. Yahweh reminded the people that there was one statute for the sojourner (visitor) and the native. On the day the tabernacle was set up, the cloud covered the tabernacle, the tent of the testimony. At evening, it was over the tabernacle like the appearance of fire until morning. It was like this every day. When the cloud settled down, the people camped. Yahweh gave the people instructions regarding the silver trumpets. They were to be a reminder of the people before Yahweh because He is our Elohim. In the second year, in the second month, on the twentieth day of the month, the people set out from the wilderness of Sinai. The people complained. This angered Yahweh. The fire of Yahweh burned among them and consumed some of the outer parts of the camp. The people began to crave the foods they had in Mitsrayim. They complained about the manna. Moshe heard the people and Yahweh was very angry. Moshe was also displeased with the people. Moshe asks Yahweh to forgive the people. Yahweh tells Moshe to appoint elders to help him lead the people. 70 Trustworthy men were appointed. They prophesied when there were in the tabernacle. Two men continued to prophesy in their camp. A young man told Moshe to make them stop. Moshe said he desired that all the Lord's people were prophets. A wind sprang up from Yahweh which brought quail from the sea. They fell beside the camp. The people gathered the quail and ate the quail. This made Yahweh angry because the people had the craving for meat. Miriam and Aharon began to speak against Moshe's wife. Yahweh struck Miriam with leprosy. Aharon begged Yahweh to forgive them and heal Miriam. Miriam was headed and shut outside the camp for seven days.

Torah Symbols: LEHEM [bread]

Exodus 23:35 And ye shall serve Yahweh your Elohim, and he shall bless thy bread, and thy water; and I will take sickness away from the midst of thee.

Psalms 37:25 I have been young, and [now] am old; yet have I not seen the righteous forsaken, nor his seed begging bread.

John 6:30-40 Therefore they said to Him, "What sign will You perform then, that we may see it and believe You? What work will You do? Our fathers ate the manna in the desert; as it is written, 'He gave them bread from heaven to eat.'" Then Yahshua said to them, "Most assuredly, I say to you, Moses did not give you the bread from heaven, but My Father gives you the true bread from heaven. For the bread of Yahweh is He who comes down from heaven and gives life to the world." Then they said to Him, "Master, give us this bread always." And Yahshua said to them, "I am the bread of life. He who comes to Me shall never hunger, and he who believes in Me shall never thirst. But I said to you that you have seen Me and yet do not believe. All that the Father gives Me will come to Me, and the one who comes to Me I will by no means cast out. For I have come down from heaven, not to do My own will, but the will of Him who sent Me. This is the will of the Father who sent Me, that of all He has given Me I should lose nothing, but should raise it up at the last day. And this is the will of Him who sent Me, that everyone who sees the Son and believes in Him may have everlasting life; and I will raise him up at the last day."
