PORTION IN A NUTSHELL - BO

The plagues continued in the land of Mitsrayim. The plague of locusts began. Locusts ate everything that was left over after the other plagues. They ate all the trees. They filled the houses. The plague of locusts ended when Yahweh sent a strong wind from the west which took the locusts away and blew them into the Red Sea. When Pharaoh refused to let the people go, Yahweh sent darkness into the land. It was so dark that people couldn't see each other.



Yahweh hardened Pharaoh's heart and Pharaoh wouldn't let the people go. He told Moshe to go away. He said, "Take heed to yourself and see my face no more! For in the day you see my face you shall die." Moshe replied, "You have spoken well. I will never see your face again." Yahweh sent one last plague. This time, Yahweh went into Mitsrayim around midnight. All of the firstborn in the land of Mitsrayim were to die. Yahweh established the Passover (or Pesach) on the 14th of Nisan. For Pesach, a perfect lamb was chosen to dwell among the Israelites for four days. Then, the whole assembly of Israel had to kill it, roast it with fire, and eat it at twilight. They were to eat it with bitter herbs and unleavened bread. Then they were to take some of the blood and put it around their doors. They were commanded to eat it quickly. That night, Yahweh went through Mitsrayim and all the firstborn in the land died (both man and beast). Yahweh executed judgment against all the gods of Mitsrayim. If blood was on the door, Yahweh passed over the door and the plague didn't destroy those in the house. [At this time, Yahweh commanded that we keep a feast unto Him on this day every year forever called the Feast of Unleavened Bread for seven days.] The Israelites did what Moshe commanded, asked the people of Mitsrayim for gold and silver and clothing. They received all that they requested. Then the children of Israel journeyed from Rameses to Succoth. There were about 6,000 men. They went out of Mitsrayim and ate unleavened bread. All of the firstborn were set aside for Yahweh.

And they [the house of Israel] will no longer defile themselves with their idols, or with their detestable things, or with any of their transgressions; but I will deliver them from all their dwelling places in which they have sinned, and will cleanse them. What does it mean to be Natzarim? "Natzarim" - watchmen

Who is the Messiah? Yahshua, the Messiah, is the servant of Yahweh and he comes both as a suffering servant (Mashiach ben Yosef) and the conquering servant (Mashiach ben David).



In the following verse do you see the suffering servant or the conquering servant? Isaiah 53:3-5 He is despised and rejected of men; a man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief: and we hid as it were our faces from him; he was despised, and we esteemed him not. Surely he hath borne our griefs, and carried our sorrows: yet we did esteem him stricken, smitten of Yahweh, and afflicted. But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed.

Do you know who this verse is talking about? Do you know why we need him? Isaiah 53:6 All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned everyone to his own way; and Yahweh has laid on him the iniquity of us all.

Yeshua is the Messiah. He suffered for our sins so that he could bring us to Yahweh. I Peter 3:18 reads, "For Messiah also hath once suffered for sins, the just for the unjust, that he might bring us to Yahweh, being put to death in the flesh, but quickened by the Spirit."

What is the nationality of Yahshua? (read John 4:7-9) Yahshua was a Jew. He was of the tribe of *Judah* (read Matthew 1:2). He obeyed his Father's commandments (read Matthew 15:10). He kept the Passover (read Mark 14:14). He kept the Sabbath (read Mark 1:21).

Questions about: Yahshua

Why do we call him “Yahshua?” (read Matt 1:21) In other words, “Yah is our salvation.” But you might wonder why the most common translations say his name is “Jesus.” Most scholars know that *Jesus* is a bad translation of his name.

Who is “Jesus?” If we were to translate *Yahshua* into English, his name would be *Joshua* but most people call him *Jesus*. Yahshua is the original Hebrew name for Jesus of Nazareth. Yahshua was the name His mother called Him when she called Him home for dinner.

What do I call him? It is good to call him Yahshua, since in the Hebrew His name has meaning. In Hebrew “Yahshua” means “Yah is Salvation.” Sometimes, people refer to Yahshua as Yahoshua, which means “Yahweh who is Salvation.”

Is it bad to call him Jesus? John 5:43 “I have come in my Father's Name, and you do not accept me, but if someone else comes in his own name, you will accept him”

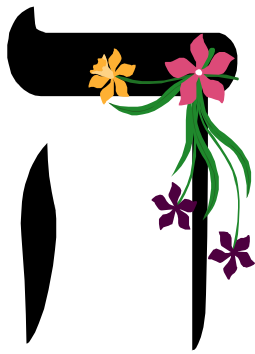
The Great Commission

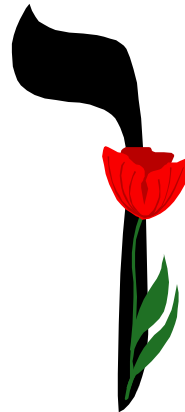
You can read more about this in Isaiah: “Also the foreigners who join themselves to Yahweh, to minister to Him, and to love the Name of Yahweh, to be His servants, every one who keeps from profaning the Sabbath, and holds fast My covenant; even those I will bring to My holy mountain, and make them joyful in My house of prayer. Their burnt offerings and their sacrifices will be acceptable on My altar; for My house will be called a house of prayer for all the peoples,” Isaiah 56:6-7.

And when you spread truth, things happen just like they did in the days of Jeremiah! “O Yahweh, my strength and my stronghold, and my refuge in the day of distress, to Thee the nations will come from the ends of the earth and say, ‘Our fathers have inherited nothing but falsehood, futility and things of no profit. Can man make gods for himself? Yet they are not gods! Therefore behold, I am going to make them know— this time I will make them know My power and My might; and they shall know that My name is Yahweh.’” Jeremiah 16:19-21!

HEBREW LANGUAGE



HEY: Hey sounds like the letter "H" and it has the numerical value of 5; it means "Lo" or "Behold." It symbolizes the definite article, *the*.



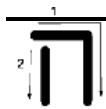
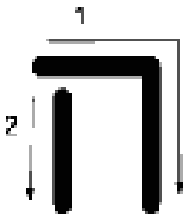

Torah Portion This Week

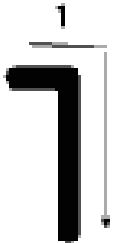
BO in Hebrew means **"GO"** or **"COME"** and is written in Hebrew below.
