Parsha Shoftim "Judaments" Deuteronomy/Devarim 16:18-21:9

Training our youth to be sons and daughters of the commandments.

"If you love me, keep my commandments." Yashua (John 14:15)

PORTION IN A NUTSHELL

SHOFTIM (JUDGMENTS)

Yahweh instructed the people to choose judges and officers for their towns. They would judge with righteous judgment. The people were not permitted to show partiality or accept a bribe. Israel is not allowed to plant any tree as an Asherah beside the altar of Yahweh our Elohim. Setting up pillars is also forbidden. If someone serves or worships the sun, moon, or any host of heaven, and it is true that they have done so, they are to be put to death on the evidence of two witnesses or of three witnesses. No one may be put to death on the testimony of just one person. If a case arises that is too difficult to decide, Israel was to go to the Levitical priest and the judge and consult with them. Israel was to obey and accept the judgment of the appointed judge and the Levitical priest. They are not to presume they know what the judge will decide and act before hearing the judgment. Israel was instructed to choose a king from among their brethren (not a foreigner). The king may not acquire many horses for himself or cause the people to return to Mitsrayim (Egypt) to acquire many horses. He shall not acquire many wives for himself. He may not acquire excessive gold and silver. The king must write for himself in a book, a copy of the law of Yahweh. This book must be approved by Levitical priests. He shall read it in the days of his life so he may learn to fear Yahweh our Elohim by keeping all the words of this law and these statutes. All the tribe of Levi has no portion or inheritance with Israel. They shall eat Yahweh's food offerings. The people were instructed to follow Yahweh's commands and refrain from offering anything to false gods or idols. Yahweh promises to raise up a prophet like Moshe from the people. They shall listen to him. He shall speak what Yahweh commands. If a prophet speaks and you don't know if it is Yahweh's word, and it does not come to pass, the prophet has spoken presumptuously. You need not be afraid of him. If he speaks in the names of other gods, he must be put to death. Yahweh commands the people to set up three cities of refuge and gives the ordinances for the cities of refuge. Yahweh instructs the people not to move their neighbor's landmark (boundary). If someone does wrong and is found guilty from the judges, you shall not pity them. It shall be a life for a life, eye for eye, tooth for tooth, hand for hand, foot for foot. When Israel goes into battle, they are not to fear for Yahweh our Elohim is with them. They are not to

panic. Officers shall ask the people who has built a new house and not dedicated it or planted a vineyard and not enjoyed its fruit or betrothed a wife and not taken her. These men are to go back to his own house. The commanders of the army will then be chosen to be heads over the people. If cities that are besieged by Israel are willing to make peace with Israel then they shall become servants of Israel. If they are not willing to make peace, they shall be plundered and destroyed. In the cities of the Hittites, Amorites, Canaanites, Perizzites, Hivites, and Jebusites, there were the Israelites not to make an offer of peace. In those cities, Israel was to leave nothing alive that breathes. Israel was not to destroy a cities trees by wielding an axe against them. They may eat



from them. Trees that are not for food may be cut down and used for siege-works. An atonement must be made for an unsolved murder by the elders of the surrounding cities. Israel must do what is right in the sight of Yahweh our Elohim.

You be the judge! Who is the culprit? How do you know?


