"If you love me, keep my commandments." Yeshua (John 4: 5)

# PORTION IN A NUTSHELL YITRO (JETHRO)

Moshe's father-in-law, Jethro (Yitro) heard all that Moshe had done for Israel and how Yahweh had brought the people out of Mistrayim (Egypt). Jethro rejoiced for all the good things that Yahweh had done. He then knew that Yahweh was greater than all other gods because he delivered the people from under the hand of the people of Mistrayim (Egypt). Jethro watched Moshe judges the people and suggested that Moshe elect judges to help him solve the people's issues and problems. This way, other people could help bear Moshe's burdens. Moshe did as Jethro suggested. Soon, the people came to the wilderness of Sinai. They camped there. Yahweh asked the people to obey his words. The people agreed to do all that Yahweh asked. The people washed their clothes and came to the mountain. On the third day there was thunder and lightning and thick clouds on the mountain. A loud trumpet blasted. The people

feared. The mountain was covered in smoke. Moshe went up the mountain in a cloud. Yahweh told him to go get Aharon (Aaron). They went up together. Yahweh spoke the 10 commandments to them.







And it shall come to pass, if thou shalt hearken diligently unto the voice of Yahweh

thy Elohim, to observe and to do all his commandments which I command thee this day, that Yahweh thy Elohim will set thee on high above all nations of the earth: And all these blessings shall come on thee, and over-take thee, if thou shalt hearken unto the voice of Yahweh thy Elohim. Blessed shalt thou be in the city, and blessed shalt thou be in the field. Blessed shall be the fruit of thy body, and the fruit of thy ground, and the fruit of thy cattle, the increase of thy kine, and the flocks of thy sheep. Blessed shall be thy basket and thy store. Blessed shalt thou be when thou comest in, and blessed shalt thou be when thou goest out.

### WHAT IS SIN: 101

What is sin? What is the Biblical definition of sin?

**1John 3:4** Whosoever commits sin transgresses also the law: for sin is the transgression of the law.

Romans 14:23 ...whatsoever is not of faith is sin.

The Bible gives us two main definitions of sin. One definition has to do with breaking the law or commandments of Yahweh. The other has to do with anything that does not originate or come from faith. Faith and obedience to Yahweh are important. They help us to grow and change before Yahweh and become mature. Through obedience and faith, we grow into the people that Yahweh calls us to be: leaders, priests, and prophets to the nations around us.

Why is sin the transgression of the law? Why is this "law" so important?

Romans 3:20 ... for by the law is the knowledge of sin.

**Romans 7:7** What shall we say then? Is the law sin? Yahweh forbid. Nay, I had not known sin, but by the law...

The Torah (law, instructions) defines what sin is and makes us aware of what we are disobeying and what to fix and adjust in our lives. The Torah is NOT SIN (nor is obedience to the Torah) or bondage but the LAW is what shows us the very character of Yahweh and how we can become more like Him. So you can see why the Apostle John says that "sin is the transgression of the law."

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## HEBREW LANGUAGE



Tet is the 9th letter in the Alef Bet. It is the number 9. It symbolizes a basket and surround, mud, clay"



Yod is the 10th letter in the Alef Bet. It is the number 10. It symbolizes a hand and means "closed, deed, and to make."



Kaf/Chaf is the 11th letter in the Alef Bet. It is the number 20. It symbolizes an arm, wing, or open hand. It means "to cover, allow, or strength."
