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What is Shavu'ot?

- It is a moedim (an appointed time)
- It is 1 of the 3 Pilgrimage feasts that require attendance in Yerushalayim
- It's the conclusion of the counting of the omer
- It's said to be the Torah was given on Mount Sinai
- It's the day the Ruach Hachodesh descended upon the Disciples in the upper room

The Moedim (Appointed Times)



Wayyiqra (Leviticus) 23: 15-17

And from the morrow after the Sabbath, from the day that you brought the sheaf of the wave offering, you shall count for yourselves: seven completed Sabbath's. Until the morrow after the seventh Sabbath you count fifty days, then you shall bring a new grain offering to Yahweh. Bring from your dwellings for a wave offering two loaves of bread, of two-tenths of an ephah of fine flour they are, baked with leaven, firstfruits to Yahweh

Wayyiqra (Leviticus) 23: 18-19

And besides the bread, you shall bring seven lambs a year old, perfect one, and one young bull and two rams. They are an ascending offering to Yahweh, with their grain offering and their drink offerings, an offering made by fire for a sweet fragrance to Yahweh. And you shall offer one male goat as a sin offering, and two male lambs a year old, as a slaughter of peace offerings.

Wayyiqra (Leviticus) 23: 20-22

And the priest shall wave them, besides the bread of the first-fruits, as a wave offering before Yahweh, besides the two lambs. They are set-apart to Yahweh for the priest. And on this same day you shall proclaim a set-apart gathering for yourselves, you do no servile work on it, a law forever, throughout your generations. And when you reap the harvest of your land do not completely reap, and do not gather any gleaning from your harvest. Leave them for the poor and for the stranger, I am Yahweh your Elohim.

Bemidbar (Numbers) 28: 26-29

And on the day of the first-fruits, when you bring a new grain offering to Yahweh at your Festival of Shavu'ot, you have a set-apart gathering, you do not servile work. And you shall bring near an ascending offering as a sweet fragrance to Yahweh: two young bulls, one ram and seven lambs a year old, with their grain offering of fine flour mixed with oil: three-tenths of an ephah for each bull, twotenths for the one ram, one-tenths for each of the seven lambs

Bemidbar (Numbers) 28: 30-31

One male goat to make atonement for you, perfect ones they are for you. Prepare them with their drink offerings, besides the continual ascending offering with its grain offering.



Debarim (Deuteronomy) 16: 16-17

Three times a year all your males appear before Yahweh your Elohim in the place which He chooses: at the Festival of Matzot, and at the Festival of Shavu'ot, and at the Festival of Sukkot. And none should appear before Yahweh empty-handed, but each one with the gifts of his hand, according to the blessing of Yahweh your Elohim which He has given you.

The term Pentecost comes from the Greek Πεντηκοστή (Pentēkostē) meaning "fiftieth"

This makes sense, since we are to count 50 days


IT'S SAID TO BE WHEN THE TORAH WAS GIVEN



Although there is no record or account of it in the Torah, Jewish people believe Shavu'ot is when Moshe descended Mount Sinai with the Torah, the one true (Law) of YAH; the Elohim of Avraham, Yissach and Yaqqob.

As one of the annual Pilgrimage Festival's, there would already be thousands of people within the city of Yerushalyim. The Disciples, being Jewish, would have already understood the significance of this day and would have probably been raised with this same belief as the Jewish People today.

IT'S WHEN THE RUACH HACHODESH WAS POURED OUT (NOT ONCE, BUT TWICE)



Ma'asei (Acts) 2:4

And when the day of the Festival of Shavu'ot had come, they were all with one mine in one place. And suddenly there came as sound from the heaven, as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. And there appeared to them divided tongues, as of a fire, and settled on each one of them. And they were filled with the Set-Apart Spirit and began to speak with other tongues, as the Set-Apart Spirit gave them to speak.

1ST TIME POURED ON THE DISCIPLES

"TO THE JEW'S FIRST"
"NATIVE BORN"

ALL OF THE DISCIPLES WERE FROM THE TRIBE OF JUDAH (JEWISH), NATIVE BORN

Ma'asei (Acts) 10: 44-46

While Kepha was still speaking these words, the set-apart spirit fell upon all those hearing the word. And those of the circumcision who believed were astonished, as many as come with Kepha, because the gift of the Set-Apart Spirit had been poured out on the nations also, for they were hearing them speaking with tongues and extolling Elohim

- Do no servile work
- > Wave leavened loaves of bread before YHWH
- > Cook meat as an ascending offering

We Celebrate


